



DISSERTATION: “IS CAT NOIR A FURRY?” A Multidimensional Analysis

An inevitable question has surely haunted every netizen at some point:

Is Cat Noir from *Miraculous: Tales of Ladybug & Cat Noir* a furry?

Visual Style	Black leather suit with cat ears, tail, and a mask. Cartoonish aesthetics.	Fursuits (full or partial), accessories, fan art. Aesthetic varies – from cartoony to realistic.

Aspect / Trait	Cat Noir (Adrien)	Typical Furry Community Member
Relation to Animal Traits	Cat features stem from the magical Miraculous; not part of his identity.	Fursona's animal traits are a core part of the user's personality and identity.
Cultural Context	Character from a mainstream TV show. Not part of a subculture.	Member of a subculture with conventions, art, and online communities.

Arguments *FOR* Considering Cat Noir a Furry

- He looks like a cat – ears, tail, claws, agility, he even meows.
- He's partially an animal, at least visually.
- For some viewers, he evokes the same emotions as a fursona crush.

Arguments *AGAINST* Considering Cat Noir a Furry

- He doesn't identify as a cat, just a human in a magical costume.
- He didn't create a fursona or participate in the furry fandom.
- He doesn't attend furry conventions. (Okay, he *would* be a hit, but that's not the point.)

Conclusion – The Verdict

Cat Noir is *not* a furry – he's simply a superhero dressed as a cat. It's like Batman – he has bat-like traits, but he doesn't hit up conventions as "Furman." Visual similarity alone isn't enough. Just because a dog wears glasses doesn't mean he's an accountant.

So:

Magical user of a Miraculous ≠ furry.

And Adrien? He might have a cat, but he's not *one of them*.
